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# **Dutch master and FringeArts partner to redefine theater**

Ivo Van Hove visits FringeArts to discuss his work in advance of his Fringe Festival show After the Rehearsal/Persona

PHILADELPHIA –FringeArts presents *LIVE REMIX*, a three-part event centered on the work of Ivo van Hove, celebrated theater artist and Artistic Director of Toneelgroep Amsterdam, the largest theater company in the Netherlands. Van Hove joins for a discussion of his screen-to-stage adaptations and to premiere his debut film *Amsterdam* in the United States. Guest curated by scholar Tom Sellar, the day's events include the film screening, a conversation with van Hove, and a roundtable with groundbreaking experimental artists. This free event takes place on Saturday, September 28<sup>th</sup> from 11am-4pm, and attendees can RSVP at FringeArts.com or by calling 215-413-1318.

Ivo Van Hove is famous for his bold, experimental screen-to-stage adaptations. He has built a long and intense relationship with Igmar Bergman's oeuvre as a director. In September's 2015 Fringe Festival, FringeArts is presenting the US premiere of *After the Rehearsal/Persona*, the source text of which is entirely written by Bergman. "He doesn't adopt a moralizing approach," says van Hove of Bergman, "but invests his work with much attention to and insights into mankind in all its matchless complexity."

With his fascination with the nuance of film, it is only natural that van Hove would delve into the cinematic medium. In 2008, he directed *Amsterdam* by Jeroen Planting, which will be screened at FringeArts on June 28<sup>th</sup> to launch a discussion about van Hove's interdisciplinary approach to theater and film, and his interest in live performance devised from film and digital media. This conversation will be immediately followed by a roundtable with American theater-makers John Collins (Artistic/Technical Director for Elevator Repair Service), Doris Mirescu (Dangerous Ground Productions), and Ryan McNamara (independent visual artist, Me3m Ballet).

This exciting event is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to get inside the brain of one of the world's most respected experimental theater artists. Ivo van Hove's work consistently dazzles audiences all over the world, prompting Ben Brantley to say of him, "At his best – which is the level he is consistently operating on these days – Mr. van Hove brings us so close to a work's white-hot emotional center that it burns as it never has before." – The New York Times.

This event is a continuation of FringeArts' ongoing efforts to build and educate audiences for international artists. Van Hove's work returns to Philadelphia in September with *After the Rehearsal/Persona*, two short works devised from Bergman screenplays about what van Hove describes as "the meaning of theater and art in our lives and society."

### **ABOUT IVO VAN HOVE:**

**Ivo van Hove** is the artistic director of Toneelgroep Amsterdam, the largest theater company in the Netherlands. Van Hove is known for his bold, actor-centered stagings of classic dramas. In collaboration with scenic designer Jan Verweyveld, van Hove uses sophisticated media to heighten theatricality and redefine the relationship between reality and fiction. Van Hove and Verweyveld continually break through the restrictions of the large theater, eliminating the natural distance between actor and audience, sometimes physically, always psychologically.

Van Hove has built a long and intense relationship with Bergman's oeuvre as a director. Past productions include: *Scenes from a Marriage* and *Cries and Whispers*.

### **ABOUT TOM SELLARS**

**Tom Sellar**, a writer, editor and curator, is Professor of Dramaturgy and Dramatic Criticism at Yale School of Drama and Editor of Yale's international performance journal Theater. A New York City native, Sellar received his Master of Fine Arts and Doctor of Fine Arts from Yale University, where he was twice awarded the John W. Gassner Memorial Prize for critical writing. He is currently completing *Mind Attacks*, a monograph on Richard Foreman and the Ontological Hysteric Theater.
