This land acknowledgement, written by Trinity Norwood, citizen of the Nanticoke Lenni-Lenape Nation: Before Philadelphia was the city we know and love today, this land was known as Lenapehoking, or Land of the Lenape. The Lenape are the indigenous people of what is modern day Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, and the southern tip of New York. Through genocide, relocations, the Indian Boarding School era, and continued systemic erasure the Lenape people have persevered and live on as modern day Sovereign Nations. We recognize their legacy that has been soaked into the very ground we stand on now, and we acknowledge the intergenerational connection to this legacy that we are all part of as descendants to the immigrants to this land. Although this history is heavy, the future is filled with hope.
