DIRECTOR'S NOTE

In the mid 70s, on his own (self described) road to becoming a rock-and-roll casualty, David Bowie moved back to Europe to escape the carnival of debauchery (ie cocaine) that was LA at the time. When he settled in Berlin, he found a city that was a metaphor for his own life at the time...rebuilt from the ashes, cut off from the rest of the world, with a wall down the middle, cutting itself in half.

He also found a robust art and music scene rising from this tension and he quickly fell in love with what he heard from the Krautrock movement, the ambient sounds of Brian Eno (his primary collaborator on these albums), and the music performance art of Klaus Nomi.

It was from these influences, the sparks in the Berlin air, and his battle with his personal demons that the Berlin Trilogy emerged: Low, Lodger, and Heroes. While not his most popular or hit-filled albums, Bowie has described them as his "DNA." They are dark, personal, and disjointed. Full of optimism and dread, often in the same song.

They are also unbelievably influential. You don't have to squint too hard to see new wave and post punk, goth and Talking Heads in these albums. Bowie also produced Iggy Pop's *The Idiot* and *Lust for Life* during this period. So there isn't much music that came after that doesn't owe a little something to Bowie's time in Berlin.

One quick aside: yes, I know that "Stay" and "Ashes to Ashes" aren't on those records, but they are definitely Berlin-adjacent (on the albums immediately preceding and following, respectively) and they sure seem to belong here, at least to my ears.

Finally, what these albums did, for me, as much as anything, is make prog rock cool, at least a little bit. I know the work of Adrian Belew and Robert Fripp (from King Crimson and the lead guitarists on *Lodger* and *Heroes*, respectively) very well, and they were never cooler than when they were with Bowie. —**Paul Green**

Red 40, aka your toxic ex-boyfriend's worst nightmare, is returning to her home stage of FringeArts where she led the house band for two years. Named a "local legend" by Philadelphia Magazine, her feminist agenda and powerhouse pipes have been featured on NPR's Sound Opinions, at Ars Nova's ANT Fest, and on many a sold-out stage. Billy Penn named her a young creator of the "new Philadelphia sound."

Johnny Showcase is a sweaty, charismatic showman from Rhode Island who is equal parts Andy Kaufman and Prince.
Carrying the torch of funk-rock pioneers like Funkadelic and Frank Zappa, he and his band the Mystic Ticket have gained a massive following and propelled Johnny to something of a funky Philly folk hero legend. He is more famous in the 4-9 year old market as his kid-centric act, Johnny Shortcake, and to the rest of the world from his confounding stint on America's Got Talent in 2021.

Jess Conda is a Philadelphia based performer, producer, teaching artist and cultural connector. Regional Theater: Wilma, Arden, Pig Iron, Shakespeare in Clark Park, Brat Productions. Cabaret: Martha Graham Cracker Cabaret, The Peek A Boo Revue, Bearded Ladies (Associate Artist/Host Cohort, Late Night Snacks). Touring backing vocals: Peter Matthew Bauer, opener for The War on Drugs and Delta Spirit. Jess is currently working as Director of Education and Community Practices at the Wilma Theater. She is celebrating her 20th Philly Fringe Festival!

Lexi Thammavong (they/she) is an actor, singer, and playwright based in Philly. They obtained their BFA in Musical Theatre with a minor in Creative Writing from The University of the Arts. Recent

credits include playing "Pamela" in *Head Over Heels* at Theatre Horizon and "Mimi" in *Rent* at the Media Theatre. Whether exploring characters like "Ariel" in *The Tempest* at Delaware Shakespeare Company or "Helen" in PAC's adaption of *Jane Eyre*, Lex strives to find new ways to explore, revitalize, and decolonize the classics. She is also experienced with writing and devising brand new work.

This summer we toured Europe as the backing band for Jon Anderson, playing 9 sold out theater shows and two festivals, including an audience of 10,000 in Bug Herzberg Germany, and along the way we played one off shows with guest stars including Steve Hackett, Chris Difford (Squeeze), Robert Martin (Zappa), and Bill Bruford.
